Much of it was on display when nearly a dozen residents filled Rayburn Hall one recent afternoon with paintings, puppets, handmade cards, and more.

Retired primary school teacher Joan Danaher, who has lived at Ferris Hills since 2020, learned quilting from a friend 30 years ago and brought some of her quilts with her.
